# OUR PHILOSOPHY

Our philosophy is that every Jewish child is entitled to a basic education regardless of family affiliation or membership.

The Chabad Hebrew School offers a warm and lively Jewish atmosphere where children can attain a unique and exciting awareness of their Jewish identity.

Indeed, a child equipped with an education and a feeling for Judaism's beautiful teachings, traditions and historical lessons is better equipped to face the awesome moral challenges of today's society.

Judaism has always taught and stressed the importance of knowledge. Through our Hebrew School, we will try to instill in the children a strong thirst for study, to gain knowledge and understanding of what Judaism stands for, a feeling for their rich heritage, a sense of responsibility, and a positive picture of themselves as Jews.

Our underlying approach is for the children to enjoy the time spent at Hebrew school so that they are left with positive feelings and fond memories of their Jewish education. Our program is carefully blended with songs, games, incentives, arts and crafts, dramatics, family celebrations, and other exciting co-curricular activities.

## OUR GOAL IS THAT EVERY STUDENT SHOULD....

- ◆ Attain a strong feeling of identity with their Jewish heritage and to develop a sense of love and pride in being Jewish.
- ◆ Gain knowledge and understanding of the Mitzvoth, traditions and practices that Judaism stands for, to study the morals, values and ethical behavior mandated by the Torah, and to develop an appreciation for all the Jewish holidays.
- ◆ Master the skills of Hebrew reading and to gradually develop the ability to understand basic Hebrew words, emphasizing prayers, so that the students will feel comfortable attending services.
- ◆ Discover and explore the incredible history of the Jewish people and its relevance for all time.
- ◆ Express their opinions and questions about G-d, Torah and religion, and to understand the importance of these things in today's society.
- ◆ Attain a Jewish perspective on life and maintain Jewish feelings and involvement beyond the years at Hebrew School and to ultimately perpetuate these to future generations.

# OUR CURRICULUM

At JUDA Hebrew School we recognize that each child is a unique individual with different learning styles and abilities.

Each lesson in Hebrew School is multi-sensory and hands on. The lessons incorporate different ways of learning so that each individual child is reached and is able to benefit. The students truly experience that which they are being taught.

Drama, song, interactive workbooks, Aleph Champ, and of course the teachers, bring Hebrew School lessons to life. Our interactive learning style encourages children to be active, rather than passive, learners.

## **OUR CURRICULUM**

**Hebrew:** Hebrew is the language of the Jewish people and it connects us to our past. The Hebrew language and prayer unite us with a sacred commonality. Our program integrates Hebrew and prayer into each weekly session by beginning each day with communal tefillah (prayer), and with our Hebrew sessions. Our individualized Hebrew reading curriculum - Aleph Champ - is the latest educational breakthrough in Hebrew reading, where children learn and grow at their own pace. Modeled after the Karate/Martial Arts motivational philosophy of color coded levels, it provides excitement and inspiration, leading the student into a winning cycle of learning.

**Prayer:** Aimed at the study and understanding of prayer and the Siddur (prayer book), focusing on the meaning of each prayer as well as some key words to remember. We want each child to be comfortable with the Siddur during services.

**Holidays:** Lessons on each Jewish holiday will fill the calendar as we proceed from Rosh Hashana and the High Holidays through the holiday of Shavuot. The students will have a deeper understanding of each holiday and its traditions.

**Mitzvot:** The children at Hebrew School will learn about many things that Jews practice and the reasons these things are done. All in a very practical hands on way.

**Jewish Music & Song:** Led by our teachers, the students will learn many Jewish songs connected to the lessons being taught.

**JUDA art room:** The students will enjoy creating many different art projects with Jewish holiday and Mitzvah themes that will add a taste of Jewish life to your home.

# ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is crucial to your child's success in Hebrew school. There is a direct correlation between attendance and achievement, interest and attitude. Adhering to the attendance policy will be greatly appreciated and will help your child get the most out of Hebrew school.

# COMMUNICATION

If there are any issues that are bothering you concerning your child's education, do not disregard them. Please talk to us so that we can make your child more comfortable and alleviate any distress immediately. We believe in a strong parent/teacher partnership. Communication between parents and Teachers is very important to ensure that Hebrew School is a meaningful and pleasant experience for your child.

# HOMEWORK

Limited homework will be assigned. Homework will generally consist of a review of Hebrew reading. Parents will be sent a weekly text from the Hebrew teacher with what their child should review. Reading practice at home is an excellent tool to improve your child's reading skills and keep you in touch with his/her progress.

# SNACK

We will be providing a snack weekly and water to drink. Please do not send in food from home. If your child has any food allergies, please let us know before school begins

# TZEDAKAH

Tzedakah (charity) is a concept which is basic to Judaism. Our school attempts to develop a commitment among our students to share with the less fortunate by donating a few pennies a day to charity. At the start of the year each class will choose a charity organization that they want to support with their Tzedakah that was given throughout the year.

Parents are asked to provide the students with a daily coin for Tzedakah if possible

# TORAH TOKENS

Throughout the year students earn "Torah Tokens" for their participation during their time at Hebrew School. These tokens will be redeemable for prizes the Sunday before each School break. Children can also receive a Torah Token for bringing Tzedakah, bringing a Mitzvah Note to Hebrew School, doing their homework, and answering questions!

# HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Communication is key to allowing us to help your child. Please let us know if there are any important factors in your child's health, such as allergies, vision, hearing, medications, etc. This will help us to be understanding and cater to his/her needs. Of course, the greatest care will be taken to maintain the confidentiality of the student/family.

Contagious Illness: Please notify us in the event of a contagious illness so that we may notify the parents of other children in the class to be aware of the symptoms.

**This year, we will be having lessons indoors and Masks will not be required.**

However—Please DO NOT send your child if they, or anyone in your immediate family, has been exposed to covid-19 within the 14 prior days.

- ◆ Please check your child's temperature at home prior to coming to Hebrew School if they may be ill.
- ◆ Keep your child home if they are showing any signs or symptoms of illness.
- ◆ Children must be symptom free (without the aid of a fever reducing medication) for 72 hours.
- ◆ If your child has an excessive and unusual runny nose, cough or sneeze, fever, vomiting, diarrhea, rash, loss of taste or smell, or any other symptoms typical of COVID-19, the student will be separated from the group until they can be picked up by a parent or guardian.
- ◆ If you, your spouse or other members of your family have a temperature or are sick, we respectfully request that you keep your child/ren home.
- ◆ The success of in person Hebrew School depends upon all families openly and honestly communicating.

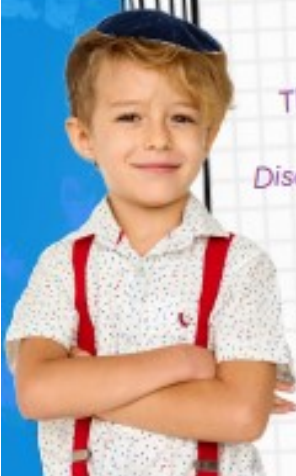
